

Olson Kundig has designed the Penthouses at Canopy with a sense of awe-inspiring openness, where sliding walls seamlessly combine lofty interiors with stunning exteriors in a fluid living experience. Extensive use of natural materials reflects the influence of the surrounding environment, creating a relaxing and revitalizing atmosphere in the living spaces.

Remarkable artistry and craftsmanship can be found throughout, from distinctive entrances, custom interior architecture features, and hardware that brings a noteworthy level of materiality and detail to the Penthouses.



HALLMARKS OF DISTINCTION

FIRST IMPRESSIONS The grand entrance features an 8' custom door with crafted steel hardware that opens to soaring 10' ceilings.

TACTILE AND NATURAL Olson Kundig-designed interiors feature organic, timeless materials, including large plank oak hardwood floors, wood cabinets and natural stone countertops, exuding warmth and rooting living environments in a strong sense of place.

LIFE OUTSIDE Sliding glass walls lead on all sides to wrap-around terraces, featuring over 1000 square feet of outdoor living space.

Glass railings instill a feeling of connectedness with the surrounding natural environment.

NO DETAIL TOO SMALL Unique and precise finishing is infused in even the smallest Penthouse detail, including crafted steel cabinet pulls.

Winner of the 2021 Wine Spectator Grand Award, SingleThread's Wine Director, Andrew Rastello, guides the function and design of the Penthouses' temperature-controlled wine rooms to ensure optimal storage and display.

And SingleThread's Head Farmer, Katina Connaughton, curates the culinary gardens on Penthouse terraces, for a fully-integrated cooking experience.

Their direction and influence ensures that Penthouse owners will embody Sonoma County's approach to food and wine: cooking and eating with the seasons, enjoying fresh herbs and greens from their kitchen gardens, and gathering over long, leisurely meals under the stars.




The Poolhouse is complete with fitness and movement studios, a living room, and a demonstration kitchen that can be transformed for business meetings.

Swim laps or work out with your personal trainer. Later, unwind on the pool deck with your favorite beverage, then spend the evening taking cooking classes, or wining and dining with a local winemaker and private guest chef.

The well-appointed living room and kitchen opens seamlessly to the pool deck, providing homeowners with a gathering place for receptions, reunions, and more. The Poolhouse also includes bike storage.

SUSTAINABILITY

At Mill District, sustainability is central to everything we do.

That commitment goes beyond embracing redevelopment
of a former industrial site, and building up into the redwood
canopy, instead of sprawling out into Healdsburg.

Mill District utilizes solar panels on every building, electric vehicle charging station infrastructure in the garage, and an expansive recycling program.

All of the power will be sourced from renewable energy sources. In-home designs incorporate low-flow fixtures, reducing water usage by up to 60%.

VITA Planning & Landscape Architecture, a renowned firm with experience on five continents, will be designing the garden landscape for Mill District. Drought-tolerant plants have been incorporated into the landscaping, and state-of-the-art irrigation systems collect rainwater and runoff. The gardens are maintained using weather synch technology, adjusting to the season, temperature, rain, and soil moisture.

Mill District is cycling and pedestrian friendly, and our vision for sustainability extends well into the future—when Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit comes to Healdsburg, it will stop across the street, obviating the need for cars. The better we take care of our environment, the more it will take care of us.




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


KEY PLAN, LEVEL 4





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
